May 2024 Kirk Session Highlights:

Proposed Union with Orwell and Portmoak: The Joint Vision Group, drawn from both congregations, is meeting monthly to progress this. Presbytery were asked for several clarifications and, while recognising the pressure on the Presbytery volunteers dealing with this matter, the Session was concerned at delays. Any union will be subject to agreement by both Kirk Sessions, members of both congregations and the Presbytery. (A good time to think about formally becoming a member if you are not one. Ask the minister.)

Kinross-shire Parish Grouping: The route to the final aim of a single parish for Kinross-shire has been of concern to avoid duplication of effort. Presbytery's proposal is initially to progress the union between Kinross and Orwell & Portmoak, and the separate union between Cleish and Fossoway. Both new united congregations should then agree a Basis of Team Ministry to allow a second minister to be appointed for the Parish Grouping, based in Fossoway and Cleish but with an agreed percentage of time devoted to the wider parish grouping.

Presbytery: Revd. Alan Reid is Moderator of the Presbytery until June 2025.

KYTHE Connect: We have been granted £100k from the Church of Scotland for a 'minister' attached to KYTHE. Revd. Alan Reid and elder George Hayton are to be our representatives in agreeing a legal agreement with KYTHE on this new role.

Kirk Session Groups: Much of the work of the Kirk Session is done through its groups. Membership of these is not limited to the Kirk Session and they are a way for any member to become involved in an aspect of the church's life which suits their talents. Speak to the Minister, or Session Clerk Jaffrey Weir, if you are interested. Reports were considered from:

Youth and Family Ministries: Sunday @7: this occasional informal evening worship attracted 30 in May, including families, young people from KYTHE and folk from other Christian groups in Kinross.

Stepping Stones for the under 5s: Well established group - storage shed for toys at rear of church has made a difference.

Dungeons and Dragons: successfully operating without Austin and Alicia Wicks.

Family Week: planning, volunteer training and safeguarding underway.

Outreach: Events organised included the visit by mission partners Ida and Keith Waddell from Zambia, Christian Aid event in the High Street, MAF visit and lunch, church presence at Farmers' Market. Folk from our partners at Great Church, Debrecen, Hungary will be visiting us for Family Week. We hope to visit them in 2025.

Pastoral: Recent Newcomers' Lunch. Visitors Group re-established. Occasional volunteers needed to give people a lift to church. Investigating PVG requirements for elders when visiting considering new guidance. Administration and Communications: We need a new volunteer for social media duties; joint weekly email with Orwell and Portmoak to be started; office coordinator can produce digital posters to promote events. Property: Church: storage shed in place, TV monitor ordered for Upper Room. Church Centre: planning approval sought for new windows to Reading Room; Manse: outside repainting approved.

Worship: no report this meeting.

Finance: 2023 accounts approved by Presbytery. Stewardship campaign planned because of expected 2024 deficit of £19k. Special collections agreed: Sept: Prospects Across Scotland (All Friends Together); Dec: Tearfund.

Safeguarding: Two further volunteers have PVG clearance

Roll of Members: Five joined as members by transfer, plus one adherent. Five removed by death and two by transfer.

Next Meeting: 2nd September 7.30pm. Anyone can attend.

PARISH GROUPING: Progress on Parish Grouping: Joint Vision Group of Kinross and Orwell & Portmoak Church

Highlights of 19th June 2024 Meeting

Congregational voting will be taking place in the coming months on the union of Kinross and Orwell & Portmoak and only those who are listed as members on the roll can vote. Adherents are not entitled to vote so would need to become members. You are encouraged to be part of this process, so if you are not sure whether you are on the member roll, please check with your Church Office.

- 1. **Steering Group meeting 2 July 2024** of the Ministers and Session Clerks of Cleish, Fossoway, Orwell & Portmoak and Kinross, looking to Presbytery to clarify how best to progress the unions.
- 2. **Governance**: special meetings of Kirk Sessions to be arranged in second half of July to discuss a structure of eldership and trusteeship proposed by the Vision Group that ensures strong governance.
- 3. **Church magazine:** a proposal to be presented to both September Kirk Sessions for a joint quarterly church magazine circulated to church members, with additional copies as a community outreach tool.
- 4. Next Vision Group meeting: 17th July 2024.
