NEW: The Fairtrade Coffee Morning in September resulted in £365 being sent to Transform Trade (previously Traidcraft Exchange). What we did not realise, until we received the certificate from Transform Trade, was that this money will allow a community shop to be set up in rural Bangladesh. Transform Trade hope to set up 100 of these shops and for each shop they require £350, so our coffee morning donation will fund one of these shops.
