NEW: Fairtrade True Origin – recall of some stock:

True Origin have worked with Eswatini Kitchens for 15 years and have had no issues with the quality of any products. Unfortunately, the last batch of products had different lids (**black lids instead of gold**) and it appears that this has affected the vacuum seal. This only came to light at the end of November, when some mould was discovered on the top of a jam. Testing has been undertaken and unfortunately this has been found to be an issue with some other jams and marmalades, and while it has not been found in any savoury products, the decision has been taken to recall the whole batch in case the shelf life has been compromised. Here is a list of the products affected. If you have any in your cupboards, please return to the stall and we will issue a refund to you.

- Lime, Orange, Orange & Cinnamon and Ruby Grapefruit Marmalade
- Peach & Ginger jam
- Hot mango, Mixed Fruit and Pineapple chutney
- Medium Curry Sauce

This is an extremely serious situation for True Origin, and they would very much appreciate your prayers and ongoing support as their other products such as the Meru Herbs sauces and jams are in no way affected. Please contact the Church Office if you have any queries.
